**Mrs. L. B. Pike Dies
of Bronchial Asthma**

Funeral Services Held Sunday Afternoon; Rev. John A. Deedrick in Charge.

RESIDENT FOR 62 YEARS

Mrs. L. B. Pike, 73, a resident of Red Oak and Montgomery county for the past 62 years, died Thursday night of last week at her home, 705 Elm-st., from bronchial asthma, her last illness being of only five days duration.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from the Boileau & Thomas chapel, conducted by Rev. J. A. Deedrick, pastor of Grace Evangelical church. Pallbearers were Howard Brannock, R. V. Stephenson, C. Frank Wilson, F. A. Burdick, I. A. Brayton and Ernest Hunter. Burial was in Red Oak Junction cemetery.

Agnes Bethany Pike was born at Glens Falls, N. Y., on Dec. 15, 1862, a daughter of Warren and Mercy Pike. She moved here with her parents in 1873, and on Dec. 7, 1881, she was married at Red Oak to L. B. Pike, who survives her, as do the following children: Mrs. Hall Henry, S. R. Pike, Van M. Pike, Geo. D. Pike, and L. Basil Pike, all of Red Oak, and H. H. Pike, of Glendo, Wyo. She also leaves eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Two daughters preceded their mother in death.
